Message from the Executive Director

For the first time since 2006, the Rural Maryland Prosperity Investment Fund (RMPIF) received \$2 million in funding for targeted investment to promote economic prosperity in Maryland's traditionally disadvantaged and underserved rural communities.

By sustaining efforts to promote rural regional cooperation, facilitating entrepreneurial activities and supporting key community colleges and nonprofit providers, the quality of life in rural Maryland can be advanced over the next several years.

During Fiscal Year 2017, a total of 43 applications were submitted with a total of \$3,279,377.47 requested. A total of 18 grants totaling \$833,501.00 were distributed to 18 organizations. Together, RMC and Volunteer Maryland will offer information sessions throughout the State for attendees to learn more about both organizations and the resources available to rural-serving organizations, including the Maryland Agricultural Education and Rural Development Assistance Fund (MAERDAF) program and RMPIF. As part of the Governor's Office of Service and Volunteerism, Volunteer Maryland administers an AmeriCorps service training program. MAERDAF Spotlight

Queen Anne's County and Allegany County Public Libraries

Queen Anne's County and Allegany County Public Libraries promote the excitement of recreational reading to boys in grade four in a program modeled after the Alaska "Guys Read" project, which brings men into the classroom to encourage boys to the fun and enjoyment of reading. The Libraries formed a partnership and have received a MAERDAF grant award for Fiscal Years 2016 and 2017.

Last year, with the help of community partners, staff of the Allegany and Queen Anne's County Public Libraries recruited and trained over 50 volunteer men who visited schools to promote reading as a fun activity. A total of 92 visits were made to six elementary schools in each of the participating counties.

Teams of two to three volunteer men, acting as "reading role models", projected and read from the grant books while the students enjoyed their lunches. For Fiscal Year 2017, the Libraries will expand the program to include 5th grade students, who were last year's 4th graders, by the students' request. In order to keep the reading momentum going, the Libraries plan to conduct two visits to 5th grade with new titles, as well as continue with eight visits to 4th grade.
