RMC brings together citizens, community-based organizations and federal, state, county and municipal government

We provide a venue for agriculture and natural resource-based industries, health care facilities, schools, and for-profits and nonprofits to cross boundaries, share info, and collectively address needs and opportunities in Maryland's rural communities.

THE COUNCIL AT WORK

Rural Roundtables

Held throughout the year with various partners, Roundtables engage rural leaders in tightly focused discussions around a specific issue, such as health care or affordable housing.

Working Committees

These provide policymakers with information, analysis, research, and suggested positions on issues that impact Rural Maryland, such as our Health Care Working Committee.

The Maryland Agricultural & Resource Based Industry Development Corporation

RMC supports the mission of MARBIDCO, which provides economic development assistance to agriculture, aquaculture, forestry, and seafood industries. (For information, visit www.marbidco.org)

The Maryland Agricultural Education & Rural Development Assistance Fund

MAERDAF awards grants for statewide and regional planning, economic and community development, and agricultural and forestry education projects. Community colleges that support small and agricultural businesses are also eligible.

Sustainable Growth

RMC provides a rural perspective for the State's sustainable initiatives and serves as a member of the Sustainable Growth Commission. The Commission was established during the 2010 legislative session as an outgrowth of the Task Force on the Future for Growth and Development.

RuralStat

RMC helped develop this interactive tool to track health and show disparities in rural counties and regions in Maryland, using various quality-of-life indicators.

Rural Prosperity Investment Fund

Created in 2006, this Maryland fund builds capacity for both non-profits and government entities in small rural areas. RMC helps raise awareness and supports the fund, and will eventually serve as its administrator, which will deliver training, business incubators, access to health care, mentorship, economic development activities and more.
