The meeting was called to order at approximately 9:03 am.

2018 Legislative Priorities

Charlotte Davis shared a draft of 2018 Legislative Priorities. There is a budget deficit of \$251 million, a decrease from what was previously projected. The Rural Maryland Council will continue to request \$6 million for the Rural Maryland Prosperity Investment Fund (RMPIF).

The Capital budget is expected to look similar to last year's. It was recommended that the dollar figure requested for Program Open Space (POS) funds be included in the budget requests section, and MARBIDCO's Next Generation Farmland Acquisition Program will receive its own bullet point to separate the line items.

Additional suggestions included:

- A sentence for support of the Chesapeake Bay Trust Fund, support for Community Legacy, and the Angel Investor Tax Credit;
- Place broadband support in economic development, include verbiage on collecting an inventory of state assets for resource sharing agreements, extension of the Task Force, and lower costs for service providers;
- A sentence regarding VLT funding;
- Emphasis on expanding telehealth with broadband services;

2018 Calendar Dates

Dates for the 2018 Legislative session, including Leg Committee meeting dates/times, the RMC Legislative Luncheon and Rural Maryland Day were shared with the Committee.

With no other updates, the meeting adjourned at approximately 9:45 pm.
