Charlotte Davis reviewed the task force charge and elements of the study and its findings due to the Governor and General Assembly on November 30th.

Ideas for Information/Presentations

Suggestions for information and presentations for upcoming taskforce meetings, included:

- Assessment of services, regulation, and acquire knowledge of basic broadband fundamentals such as external pipes and fiber works.
- Federal Communication Commission (FCC) funds, broadband mapping grants (companies, census blocks), and other additional sources for leveraging federal funds and sources, and identify a return on investment.
- Review other states (such as New York) and their implementation of broadband, strategies for paying for broadband services.
- Review of broadband for institutions, education system.
- Research open access capabilities with Verizon and Comcast.
- Research rural broadband in the Farm Bill.

Suggestions for the meeting schedule included meetings taking place regionally, establishing county-level taskforce levels, and offering meetings virtually via an online conference feature so that statewide representatives can participate.
