Message from the Executive Director

The 2023 Maryland General Assembly Legislative Session adjourned on Monday, April 10, 2023. The Rural Maryland Council's grant programs the Rural Maryland Prosperity Investment Fund and the Maryland Agricultural Education Rural Development Assistance Fund, received level funding in Fiscal Year 2024. We thank Governor Wes Moore, Senate President Bill Ferguson, and House Speaker Adrienne Jones for their support. During the session, the RMC Legislative Committee met to discuss bills, testimonies, and other legislative matters. Four events were held during the session including a Welcome Breakfast for Legislators that was held on January 13, 2023, at the Maryland Inn in Annapolis, Maryland. We would like to thank our sponsors <u>Maryland Farm Bureau</u>, Maryland Community Action Partnership, Maryland Rural Health Association and the Community Development Network for their generosity in sponsoring the breakfast. Our Legislative Lunch was held on Friday, January 27, 2023, at the Calvert House in Annapolis, Maryland in partnership with <u>Forever Maryland</u>. Secretary Kevin Atticks, Maryland Department of Agriculture was our featured guest speaker. Rural Maryland Day was held virtually on February 9, 2023, attendees were able to connect with legislators one on one to discuss the issues of rural Maryland. Maryland Day was held on Friday, March 24, 2023, at Lawyers Mall in Annapolis, Maryland. We would like to give a special thank you to the sponsors -Maryland Broadband Cooperative, Southern Maryland Agricultural Development Corporation, Maryland Department of Agriculture- Maryland's Best, Horizon Farm Credit, MARBIDCO, Maryland Heritage Areas Coalition, and the Southern Maryland National Heritage Area. The RMC is grateful for the hard work of its Legislative Committee and rural advocates who made the 2023 session a success.

The RMC Grant Cycle has closed for Fiscal Year 2024. We received 187 applications requesting \$17,981,664 in funding. There was a total of 100 MAERDAF applications requesting \$3,672,140 and a total of 87 RMPIF applications requesting \$14,309,524. The RMC Grant Review Board will meet on Friday, June 9, 2023, to discuss Phase 1 -Letters of Intent submissions. Thank you to all of the organizations that applied for our grant programs for Fiscal Year 2024. Awardees will be announced the week of August 14, 2023.

Comptroller of Maryland Announces New Advisory Councils and Work Groups to Help Guide Agency

Maryland Comptroller Brooke Lierman announced that she will be convening 11 new Advisory Councils and Work Groups to provide opportunities for members of the public to help advise the agency on its strategic direction. An application process has been opened for those who would like to serve on these groups.

"A key recommendation of our Transition Report was to strengthen the links between the Comptroller and community by creating work groups to hear from residents, make recommendations, and ask questions of the administration. Today's announcement is a major step forward toward delivering on that goal and ensuring that our operations are strongly and continually rooted in best serving Marylanders," Maryland Comptroller Brooke E. Lierman said. "I am excited to build these new bridges between our team and the public and encourage anyone interested in applying to do so right away."

The Office of the Comptroller will establish 11 new Advisory Councils and Work Groups, including:


- Business Advisory Council

- Information Technology Work Group
- Labor Advisory Council
- Local Government Advisory Council
- New Americans Advisory Council

- Women's Economic Empowerment Council

The Comptroller's Advisory Councils and Work Groups are expected to begin meeting this summer. Groups will meet quarterly, and members will serve two-year terms. Only those individuals who submit a completed application will be eligible to serve on an Advisory Council or Work Group. The deadline to apply is June 23, 2023. The case studies show how it can all come together in the form of a project – and while not every aspect of the case studies may apply to your effort, they tend to underscore the diverse funding streams that make it happen and the tenacity that anyone must have to pull off this work in rural communities. MAERDAF Spotlight - MAGIC uses a \$15,000 RMC grant to reimagine cybersecurity careers in rural communities

One Westminster, Maryland non-profit organization seeks to address the unmet need for future cybersecurity professionals as well as a desire to reverse the brain-drain trend in rural communities. While a huge supply and demand gap in any industry is troubling, what's even more concerning is the rise in the number of incidents in ransomware attacks, data breaches, and other cyber-attacks. The grant project called CyberJobs is the creation of Mid-Atlantic Gigabit Innovation

Collaboratory, Inc. (MAGIC), and is supported by a \$15,000 Maryland Agricultural Education and Rural Development Assistance Fund (MAERDAF) grant, administered by the Rural Maryland Council. MAGIC has been able to expand the program into new rural counties, including Allegany, Charles, Frederick, Carroll, Garrett, and St. Mary's counties, and engage new partners to help meet their grant goals.
